INSTRUCTION TO AUTHORS

The Health Science Journal welcomes all kinds of health-related articles i.e. editorials, original articles, review articles, letters to editor, or short communications. Each article must not be published elsewhere, and the article should not exceed 15 pages.

Manuscripts should be typed in double space on one side of white A4 paper. The manuscripts can also be submitted in the form of a word-processing file in a diskette.

On the first page should appear the authors' name, affiliation and a running title. The abstract should be on the second page. The body of the article will begin from the third page. The structure of original article should be in the following order: introduction, materials and methods, results, discussion, conclusion, acknowledgement and references.

Each table or figure should be prepared on a separate sheet. Photographic prints must be in black and white, sharp with high contrast, and the size should not be smaller than the postcard size.

If a reference has more than one author, all authors' names should be listed. However, if there are more than 7 authors, only three names are required, and the rest of them are to be represented by 'et al'.

Abbreviations should be based on the U.S. National Library of Medicine in Index Medicus.

Three copies of the manuscript should be sent to the Editor at the following address:

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All submissions will be acknowledged by the Editorial Board. Those unaccepted will also be notified. The Editorial Board reserves right to edit all manuscripts for proper publication according to the format of the Journal.

Twenty reprints will be supplied to the principal author after the publication of each article.
