



Instruction to Authors

The Journal of Health Science welcomes all kinds of health-related articles, i.e. editorials, original article, review articles, letters to editor, or short communications. Each article must not be published elsewhere, and the article should not exceed 10 page.

Manuscripts should be typed in double space on one side of white A 4 paper.

On the first page should appear the author's name, affiliation and a running title. The abstract should be on the second page. The body of the article will begin from the third page. The structure of original article should be in the following order: Introduction, materials and methods, results, discussion, conclusion, acknowledgement, and references.

Each table or figure should be prepares on a separate sheet. Photographic prints must be in black and white, sharp with high contrast, and the size should not be smaller that the postcard size.

Reference should be in the order according to the following examples.

If the reference has more than one author, all author's name should be listed. However, if there are more than six authors, only six names are required, and the rest of them are to be represented by "et al".

Abbreviations should be based on the U.S. National Library of Medicine in Index Medicus.
